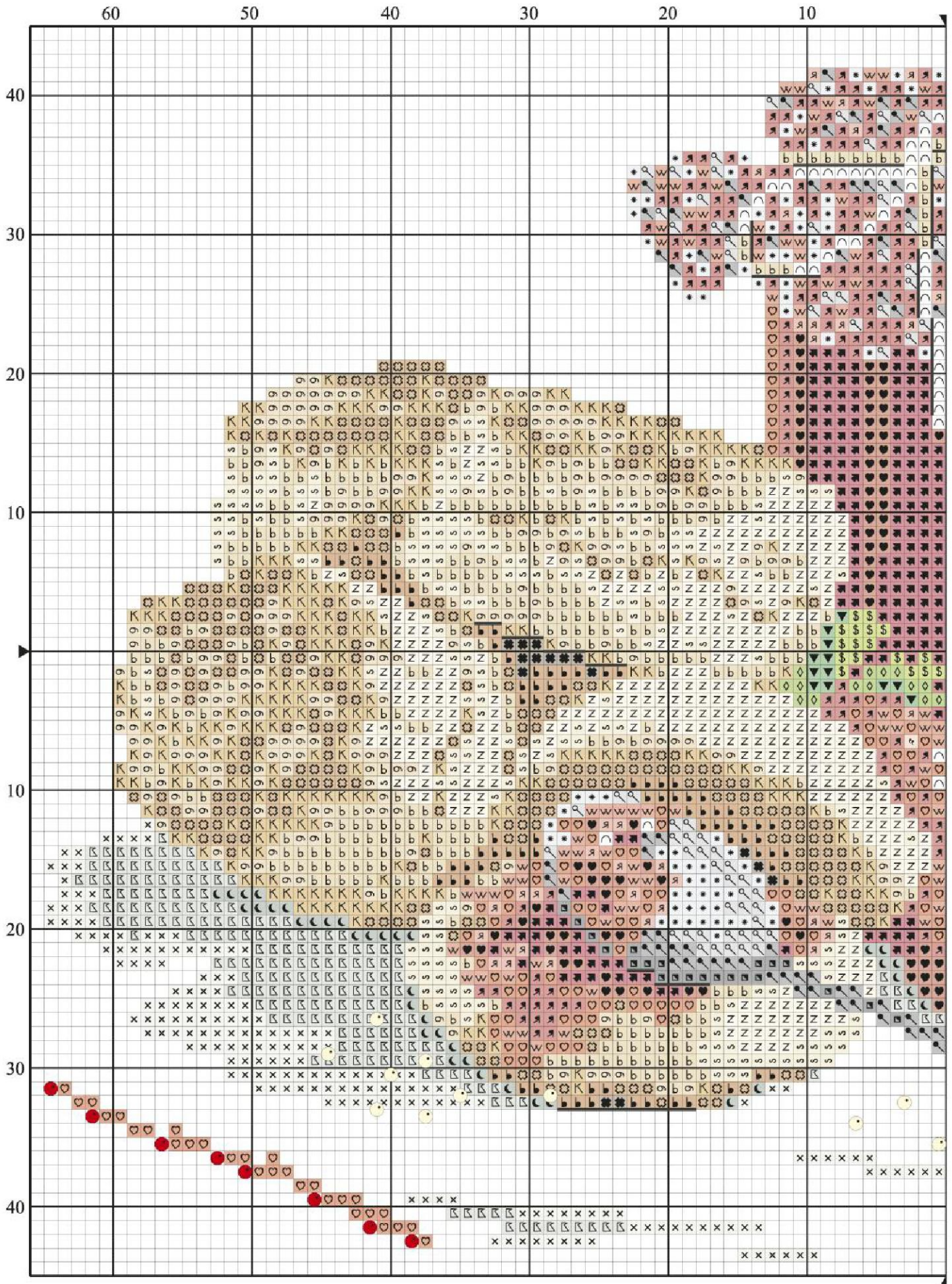
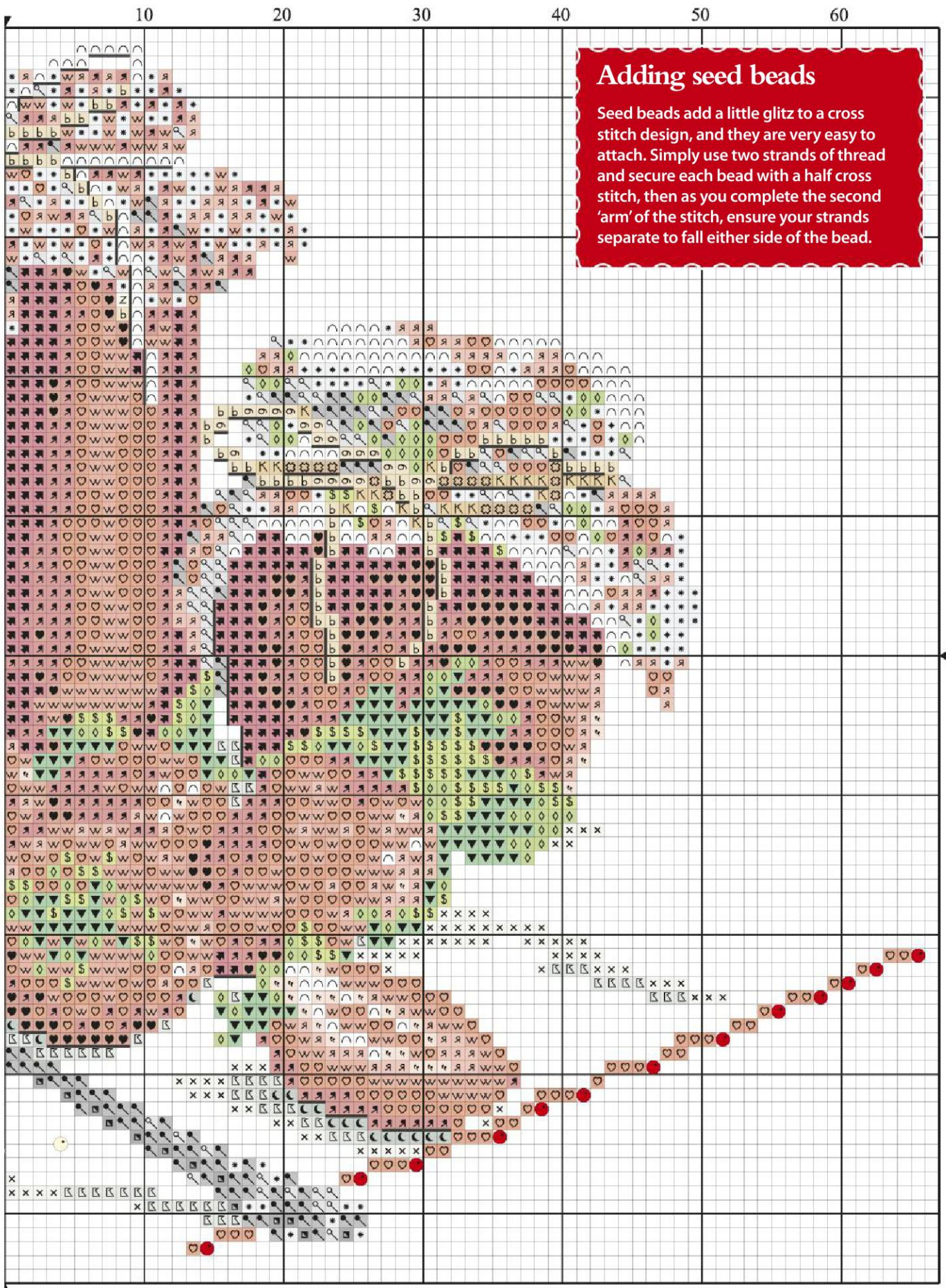


Kitchen hanging







Stitch count: 28 high x 33 wide

Design size: 5x5.5cm (2x2¼in)

Stitch time: 2 hours

This design was stitched on 28 count evenweave over two threads of fabric.

Stuff with lavender and add a ribbon loop to turn this into a pretty hanger for your kitchen

Materials

Pin cushion

- Zweigart 28 count white Cashel linen, ref: 3281/100; 10x11.5cm (4x4½in)
- Cotton fabric for back; 10x11.5cm (4x4½in)
- Stranded cotton as listed in the key
- Size 26 tapestry needle
- Toy stuffing

Make a... pin cushion

Step 1

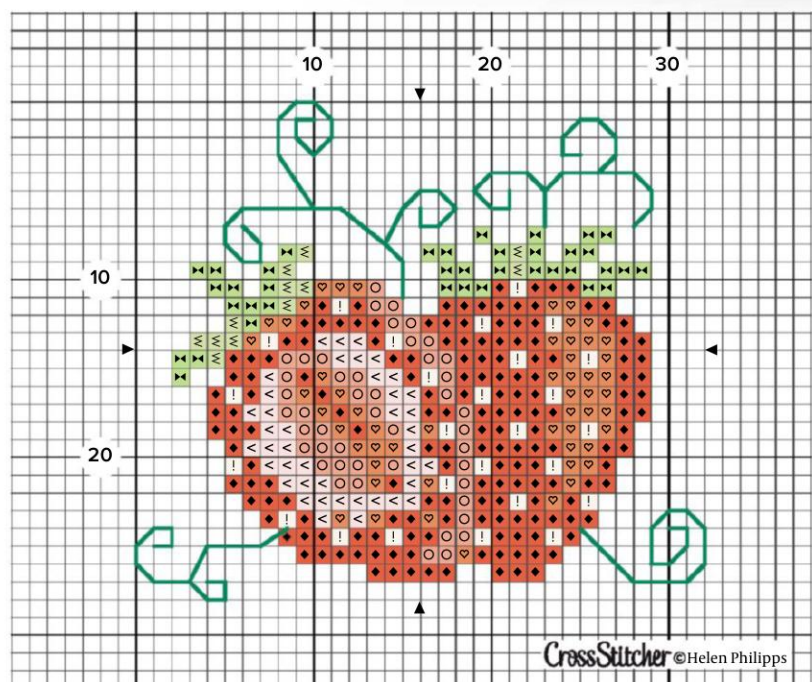
PLACE the stitched strawberry and the backing fabric right sides together.

Step 2

MACHINE stitch around the edge of the pin cushion, with a 1.25cm (½in) seam allowance, leaving a gap at the bottom for turning. Trim the seam allowance and clip the corners.

Step 3

TURN the pin cushion to the right side, and fill with toy stuffing. Sew up the gap at the bottom with small, neat stitches.

DESIGN AREA 14 HPI (28-count evenweave) – 16x24cm (6¼x9¼in)

This design was stitched using DMC stranded cotton on 28-count evenweave over two threads of the fabric

How to make a hanging

1 Trim your finished design, leaving a 2cm (¾in) border all around.

2 Cut four panels of fabric: two 19.5x8cm (7½x3in) pieces for the sides, two 34.5x8cm (13½x3in) for the top and bottom.

3 Place the side panels and your stitched piece right sides together and pin. Stitch in place, either by hand or machine with a 2cm (¾in) seam allowance. Press the seam open on the wrong side, so that the fabric layers lie flat.

4 Repeat, pinning the bottom panel of fabric and your stitched piece right sides together. Stitch in place, again with a 2cm (¾in) seam allowance. Do the same again with the top panel, and press all the seams open again.

5 Cut a piece of backing fabric the same size as your front piece (stitched piece plus fabric borders). Place the backing fabric and front piece, right sides facing, and neatly stitch all around, leaving a 4cm (1½in) gap along one edge. Turn right side out and slipstitch the gap closed. Press all the way around the border for a neat, flat finish.

6 Now finish with hanging loops. Fold two 20cm (7½in) ribbon lengths in half and sew in place on the hanging front, decorating with buttons. Stitch across the top of the ribbons, 2cm (¾in) down, and slide in a wooden spoon or dowel.
