- ✕ Stranded cotton as listed in the key
- ✕ Size 24 tapestry needle
- ✕ Backing fabric of your choice measuring 30x20cm (11¾x7¾in)
- ✕ Dowel rod measuring 22cm (8½in) from local stores, painted white
- ✕ Handmade cord using colour-coordinating threads from the design

How to...

make a hanging

- 1 Trim your finished** stitching, leaving a 2cm (¾in) seam allowance around the bottom and sides and 5cm (2in) at the top.
- 2 Cut one panel** of coordinating backing fabric to the same size as your stitched piece.
- 3 Place your stitching**, right sides together, with your piece of backing fabric and pin in place leaving three aida squares around your stitching. Machine- or hand-sew together along the bottom and sides only.
- 4 Turn through to** the right side and press.
- 5 Fold the top** edge over to the back of your stitching by 1cm (¼in) to create the neat edge, and then turn it again, as a double hem. Make sure to allow enough space for the dowel rod to fit through. Pin in place and machine-stitch, then insert your dowel into the casing.
- 6 To finish**, twist two lengths of thread from the design together (or use a cord maker by Kreinik*), to create cord to hang!
